## Modesto Community Based Outpatient Clinic

The Modesto Community Based Outpatient Clinic is one of ten facilities within the VA Palo Alto Health Care System, Veterans Health Administration's largest health care system in Northern California. The Modesto Community Based Outpatient Clinic serves California Veterans in the central San Joaquin Valley.



Established in 1998 at a shared-location on McHenry Avenue, the Modesto Community Based Outpatient Clinic was opened to provide medical and mental health services to Veterans at a location closer to their home, improving their access to care.

The current location of the Modesto Community Based Outpatient Clinic on Oakdale Road was established in February 2013, more than doubling their previous square footage to a 23,250-square-foot, stand-alone facility.

The Modesto Community Based Outpatient Clinic has 20 exam rooms and robust services, including general medicine, radiology (x-ray), phlebotomy (lab), physical and occupational therapy, mental health and social work services, and home-based primary care. In addition, the clinic offers an array of routine medical maintenance services, including immunizations, referral for cancer screenings and diabetic education. The clinic also offers limited hearing aid repair and speech therapy services.

As a state-of-the-art medical clinic, the Modesto Community Based Outpatient Clinic offers "telehealth" to its Veterans, an Internet video-based appointment with providers at distant locations. While more clinics are always under development, the telehealth clinics are currently offered in TeleUrology, TeleRheumatology, TeleGI, TeleMOVE/TeleNutrition, TeleSleep and TelePolytrauma.

As an integral part of the award-winning VA Palo Alto Health Care System, the staff and volunteers of the Modesto Community Based Outpatient Clinic are proud to be "Serving those who Served."
